In August 2014, she became the clergy caucus co-leader of the Gamaliel Networks' Metropolitan Congregations United, an organization that resourced clergy and congregations in the early stages of the Ferguson movement. She planted <u>Liberation</u> Christian Church (DOC) in April 2009 seeking to create a church that offers a complete gospel, liberating lives and liberating communities.
